02-2025**

Proposal:

This addition is meant to clarify the membership requirement.

Background/Justification:

Some members feel the language of Paragraph 5 is not clear enough and doesn't specifically state that EMT-B certification must be maintained in order to remain a member at HCFAS.

Change (additions are underlined and deletions are ~~stricken~~):

ARTICLE III, SECTION 2 - ACTIVE MEMBERSHIP

All members, except Administrative members or members designated as permanent dispatchers, accepted after January 1, 2016 must be enrolled into a New York State Emergency Medical Technician (Basic) class within eighteen (18) months of their date of acceptance, and must have obtained a New York State Emergency Medical Technician (Basic) certification within three (3) years of their date of acceptance. Additionally, members' EMT-B certification must be maintained on a continuous basis. Failure to comply with these ~~this~~ requirements will result in the loss of membership. Administrative personnel and members designated as permanent dispatchers shall pass through all steps in the membership application process except, they will be exempt from the New York State Emergency Medical Technician (Basic) certification requirement.

136 I am glad to report that many members who let their CPR card lapse have since renewed, many
137 still need to renew their AHA/FA card. Let me outline who needs what according to HCFAS
138 SOP's and By-Laws. If you are a member who joined before January 1, 2016 you need at a
139 minimum, your CPR card and AHA/FA credentials. If you are an EMT and your card has not
140 expired you are good to go. If you decide not to refresh your EMT you must obtain a CPR and
141 AHA/FA credentials to be in the building to do a shift. I would hope everyone with an EMT
142 card refreshes, the CME program is great, much of the work can be done on line and our monthly
143 review trainings are accepted for the non-core portion. Those members who joined on or after

January 1, 2016 must be in an EMT class in approximately 18 months and have acquired your EMT-B card by the end of the 4th year.

The skills the members obtain from training in a class setting and on duty will stay with you forever. Keep those skills up, we need them and the patient needs them as well.

358 **manner. All Finger Read Adjustments must be submitted to your Day Captain for**

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The Suffolk Educational program for Retention in the Voluntary Emergency Service (SERVES) -Bob Franz

The SERVES Administrative Guide is posted on the bulletin board and is available on line – Go to www.suffolksbravest.com.

Suffolk County resident student volunteers may attend a college or university in Suffolk or Nassau County or take on line courses from accredited institutions of higher education or attend an authorized workforce vocational training program in Nassau or Suffolk County. See the Guide for eligibility criteria. SERVES provides a reimbursement based upon tuition costs at Suffolk County Community College. The student-volunteer will receive reimbursement based upon a sliding scale related to their GPA. **The application and supporting documentation for each semester must be submitted no later than the 8th Friday of the academic calendar.**

SUNY RECONNECT – FREE COMMUNITY COLLEGE FOR ADULTS IS HERE

Free Associate Degrees for individuals Age 25 to 55 **with no current degree**. Students can earn degrees in growing fields like health care, automotive service specialists, computer science, **EMT – Paramedic**, Nursing, biology and mathematics, etc. Half of NYS’s Paramedic programs are offered at SUNY and CUNY institutions – attend a program and come out with an Associate Degree. Property Tax Exemption

The TOH released the 2025-2026 property tax bills and a quick review of some bills indicate that the bills include the Volunteer Ambulance Workers’ 10% property tax exemption.

NYS Bills delivered to the Governor

S1515/A2177A - The bill which was advocated by South Country Ambulance Chief Greg Miglino has passed the Senate and the Assembly – the bill Removes EMS from the limit on real property tax levies by local governments. The bill takes effect immediately upon being signed by the Governor. (Senator May/Assemblywoman Lupardo). **Delivered to the Governor 12/8/25.**

S7501 /A8086A –The bill passed the Senate and the Assembly. The bill Directs Counties, in coordination with their regional emergency services councils, to develop and maintain comprehensive county emergency medical system plans that provide for coordinated emergency medical systems within such counties. The planning process shall include cities, towns and villages within their jurisdiction. The plan shall be completed within six months. The bill takes effect immediately upon being signed by the Governor. (Senator May/Assemblyman Otis). (This bill is a part of the EMS being considered as an essential service bill that was removed from the budget). **Delivered to the Governor 12/8/25.**

SEMSCO September meeting Legislative Committee: Goal has been to come up with guidance for counties, cities, towns, etc. to prepare for a comprehensive plan for counties. Working on a collection of bullet points to facilitate that process. Hope to have a document of some type at the December meeting.

S31/A34: The bill passed the Senate and the Assembly. The bill provides that the NYS thruway authority shall issue permits for ambulances and fire vehicles for toll exemptions when engaged

in emergency operations. The bill takes effect immediately upon being signed by the Governor. (Senator Comrie/Assemblyman Eachus). **Delivered to the Governor 12/1/25 and vetoed 12/5/25.**

S688/A5619 - The bill passed the Senate & Assembly. The bill amends the real property tax exemption for surviving spouses of volunteer Firefighters and Ambulance workers killed in the line of duty. The bill allows municipalities to extend the exemption to un-remarried spouses of members with service between two and five years, provided they were receiving the exemption prior to their death. The bill takes effect immediately upon being signed by the Governor. (Senator Martinez/Assemblyman Stern). **Delivered to the Governor 12/1/25 and Signed 12/5/25 Chap. 592.**
