President's Report – Henry Waldron – Report Posted

As we move into the fourth quarter, I just want to remind everyone to check their hours for compliance.

There also seems to be some confusion about the MRN (Medical Record Number) on the EPCR. The MRN is required to be listed on the incident tab just above the times section where it says patient number. Enter the six-digit number. This can be obtained upon patient check in at the registrar. It is also available on the intake chart in sticker format.

Keep in mind you still must obtain all billing information for your EPCR. (Medicare or Medicaid number, private insurance number, driver's license number, SS#, etc).

The MRN assists us with billing information with the hospital, but is not directly linked at this time. One other item that must be used is the Flow Chart. The BLS assessment, and ALS assessment are required items. It helps us coordinate patient care with our third-party billing company.

401 proper LOSAP form and enter the required information in a legible manner. All Finger Read
402 Adjustments must be submitted to your Day Captain for correction within 30 days of the event.
403 The 2025 LOSAP Point listing posted on the bulletin board is being updated periodically. It is
404 requested that each member review their points and report in writing any discrepancies to the
405 LOSAP point committee. All review trainings must be completed & submitted by December 31,
406 2025 to be eligible for LOSAP points for 2025. Review Trainings should be completed on a
407 monthly basis, please do not do more than a maximum of two review trainings in a single day.

438 LOSAP benefit statement which was distributed to you recently.
